Ansh: "Rock."




Allison: "When I was a baby, my mom brought me one, and it's a

Miho: "Do you think people are living there?"


Allison: "Polar Bear!"

difficult.




Dean heard the conversation, and he started to rebuild the skateboard by starting to put some small wooden blocks on the bottom as a base.
